II. Accomplishments

1. Discovering the masterpiece of Asian independent film

By discovering and introducing talented directors and works from areas that are alienated from the world stage such as Vietnam and Pakistan, the growth potential of Asian films has been enhanced. Especially, films in the New Currents section and the A Window on Asian Cinema sections, the films from countries that has relatively small scale of film industry, improved and were applauded from the audiences who want to explore variety genre of film

2. Active Participation of wide level of the Audiences

There were various places for screening not only in Busan Cinema Center and Centum City but also 10 screenings were held at the night time in Busan Citizens Park which is located in the center of Busan. In Nampo-dong, the audiences could experience a lot of events including the official screenings and Community BIFF. Particularly, films from the Open Cinema section which was screened at the BIFF Theater, Busan Cinema Center were adored by the audiences and some were even sold out.

3. Successful settlement of Community BIFF

Community BIFF, newly founded last year, could be defined as a film festival in a film festival. It has been acknowledged by designing programs for children to adults. While connecting the traditions of the early film festival, where filmmakers and citizens met frankly, it presented an alternative for interacting between the audience and the film festival. In the future, it will broaden its territory as a cultural hub and an audience friendly platform.

4. Successfully Completed New Challenges of Asian Film Market 2019

2,188 professionals participated in the event, which has increased by 22 percent than last year, 200 companies participated and actively engaged in production, investment, acquisition, distribution and sales for film, broadcasting and original content rights, which has increased by 17 percent than last year. In the broadcasting copyright, more than 2-million-dollar worth of involvement was held as well as the largest participation of European sales agency was recorded for this year. Various pitching events proved its keen interest by recording the largest number of meetings ever, and the Asia Contents Awards, which was held for the first time this year, marked a successful start with full-seat selling.

Ⅶ. Summary of Platform BUSAN 2019

Platform BUSAN, which marks its third year, has been a venue for active communication among Asian filmmakers from 25 countries, with broader and more practical programs compared to previous years. Through the Filmmaker's Talk, the opportunity to directly meet with the masters of film industry was provided. Also, to strengthen the program that actually helps independent filmmakers, Platform BUSAN has expanded the opportunity to listen to producers' know-how as well as discussions about film investment, distribution and fund. In addition, to enhance the networking of participants which is the main purpose of Platform BUSAN, every morning the applicants had Breakfast Networking at the Platform BUSAN Lounge to share their work or new ideas, encouraging communication among participants and finding opportunities for collaboration. As the number of individual participants increased by about 30 percent and the rate of re-participation increased by about 15 percent compared to previous years, Asian independent filmmakers showed a growing interest in Platform BUSAN.

IX. Summary of Community BIFF 2019

Community BIFF is a spin-off film festival experimenting with the audience-centeredness which the Busan International Film Festival hounded for a long time in a new media environment. In addition to the director of the Busan Museum of Movies Park Chae Sung and director Owen Cho, actor Kim Eui-sung newly joined as a co-director, thus consummating the triumvirate.

BIFF Square, Nampo-dong, birthplace of the film festival, became revitalized thanks to the Community BIFF events. This not only carried on the tradition of the early Busan International Film Festival where cineastes and citizens meet freely but also presented the interactive method of alternative between the audience and the festival. Achieving both accomplishments that are not seemingly compatible is the biggest triumph of the 'Community BIFF 2019.'

From children to elderly and women, the target audience also ran the gamut. Besides films, various programs covering a wide range of interests such as food and drinks and liberal arts were arranged. Commensurate with the trend that 'Community' receives attention as the one leads the culture; Community BIFF will keep extending its domain to a diversified culture hub and also an audience-friendly platform.

3. BIFF Mecenat Award

Underground is a multi-sensory documentary film that guides us to the underground world we have never seen before. This film captures various countenance and depicts segmented fields of laborers working in inconspicuous places, and threatening anxiety through multilayered perspective and sophisticated sound.

The director, HUO Ning took a lot of time to build the relationship with his object and succeeded in sneaking into the most intimate moments of his family. This royalty to

the foundation of documentary filmmaking was very impressive while many documentary films seemed to neglect such fundamental efforts and stay just on the surface of things.

The main character boy - Ma Xiang's face and body get changes in about 7 years. It implies not just lapse of time but also the influence from the change of conditions around him, in short, capitalism. In those changes, only the religious rituals and the steam of ra-men give the connection between different time and space. This is a very traditional documentary film in terms of following one person, but gets the utter strength from that simplicity.

It is also a strong example of coming of age movie focused on the complex life of a female character and her progressive step-by-step -understanding of the adult dimension. Moving On is a movie capable to deliver an important and touching message underling the importance of being a family despite the everyday difficulties and the importance of respect the each other feelings and private stories. There is an amazing scene in the movie that even stands amongst the others and depicts in depth the grandfather character with the use of a nostalgic song. Thanks to that moment the main protagonist acts as an observer who eventually overcomes the feeling of loss and decides to move on with her life and believes starting to become a woman.

12. CGV Arthouse Award

Winner: LUCKY CHAN-SIL|KIM Cho-hee | Korea

Of all the films submitted this year, there's a drift towards increasing female-centric films led by women filmmakers. Among a variety of stories represented by women intertwined with different relationships, the film LUCKY CHAN-SIL stands out with a ingenious and entertaining plot that creates unpredictability, filled with attractive characters based on the stable acting skill and masterful directing. It was a film that made us fall in love with the actor Leslie Cheung again as much as CHAN-SIL was. It is a film that entails a lot of love for the movie.

13. Directors Guild of Korea Award

Winner 1: Moving on | YOON Danbi | Korea

Moving on shows how people grow up through the hurts and relationships with a delicate touch. This film features the director's tenacity dragging out the outstanding performance from actors and actresses of all ages, and the trans-generational insight into the life.

Winner 2: LUCKY CHAN-SIL | IM Cho-hee | Korea

LUCKY CHAN-SIL is a film about a woman discovering a unknown possibility of her own after the failure. What's stunning about this film is director's talent to put at liberty adorable characters, ingenious cinematic imagination, refined humor and warm feelings into one film.

14. CGK&SamyangXEEN Award

Winner: Kyungmi's World | Cinematographer KIM Gilja (Korea)

By maintaining a consistent tone and look, the camera of Kyungmi's World leads audience to the world of Kyungmi who is seemingly absent in the film (a mother and also a daughter).

The calm but intense structure and powerful close-up shots linger in audience's mind even after film is over. A cinematographer, who endured difficulties and finished shooting despite the harsh production conditions, deserves to be praised.

15. Citizen Critics' Award

Winner: Moving On | YOON Danbi| Korea

It is a film that shows how considerate the director is to all the family members and depicts the daily lives of the family in a delicate and warm way. The film is a rare achievement that brings nostalgia to the audiences in one summer night at the grandfather's house which is a retrospective space.

16. Busan Cinephile Award

Winner: Que Sea Ley(Let It Be Law) | Juan SOLANAS | Argentina

This film unwaveringly pushes the issue of women's rights and the abortion laws. It proposes that politics and religion should be separated not only for the Argentine women but also for

the women worldwide. As the film ends, the audiences are able to realize that the modern perception toward the problem has just started.
