II. Awards

1. New Currents Award

[Winner 1] The Land of Morning Calm | PARK Ri-woong | Korea

Jury Comment: *The Land of Morning Calm* demonstrates Park Ri-woong's impressive storytelling skills and ability for subtle emotional depth. The film explores the personal struggles of its characters while shedding light on the hardships of a rural coastal community. Through precise, deliberate pacing, Park navigates themes of economic uncertainty, loss, xenophobia, and societal prejudice, creating a narrative that never falters. The ensemble cast delivers terrific performances, portraying layered characters with nuance, while Park brings clarity to their inner turmoil and the broader social issues, resulting in a powerful, resonant drama.

[Winner 2] MA – Cry of Silence | The MAW NAING | Myanmar/ Korea/ Singapore/ France/ Norway/ Qatar

Jury Comment: *MA* – *Cry of Silence* is honored for its courageous portrayal of resistance to historical and ongoing political challenges under Myanmar's political junta. Poetic and contemplative, using precise language and a clear understanding of the economy of means, the film illustrates both individual and collective awakening of female factory workers in solidarity and resistance in the face of being confined to an oppressive system and brutal working conditions. The Maw Naing's film powerfully advocates for human rights and dignity under pressure in a repressive regime, serving as an urgent call to action.

4. Sonje Award

[Winner 1] Yurim | SONG Jiseo | Korea

Jury Comment: In contrast to other short films that resemble Korean TV dramas, this film presented a profound contemplation on its structure as a short film, particularly in how it captures the actors through the camera and the deliberate choices of what to frame and what to exclude. The film delicately explores the themes of familial connections, fate and choice, and that the power to change our perspectives lies within ourselves. The world surrounding the two women resonates deeply, both emotionally and viscerally.

Jury Comment: This intricately crafted work beautifully captures the intersections of cultures, exuding a sense of wonder and softness. 5. Actors of the Year

[Actors of the Year - Male] YOO Lee-ha | The Final Semester | Korea

Jury Comment: *The Final Semester* brings close to the audience the joys and sorrows of young laborers in Korea. The film delicately dissolves into the narrative the emotions of Chang-woo, Woo-jae, and Seong-min, cheering on and comforting our young friends who are entering the real world for the first time.

Actor Yoo Lee-ha managed to subtly portray the character of Chang-woo as a teenager becoming a breadwinner in today's society. His manner of acting through his eyes and



through word duly conveyed to the audience the troubles he was facing, and also his internal struggles. By showing how the character adapts to each setting of the workplace, school and home, Yoo Lee-ha through Chang-woo managed to represent how teenagers feel at the brink of graduating high school. I look forward to his acting, which shows a good balance of emotion - not too much, not too little.

[Actors of the Year - Female] PARK Seoyun | Humming | Korea

Jury Comment: There are some childhood friends who you just cannot forget, even after not seeing them for so long, you remember ever so vividly their voice, their expression, their body language. And their feelings and mood. When an actor portrays a character, the message or the story might fade away in the audience's mind over time, but if the character's feelings can linger with the audience. It is as if the actor were to gift to the audience a new friend. Although I know the character is fictional, I feel as though I have made a new friend, Mi-jeong, through the actor. [Winner] Insert | LEE Jong-su | Korea

The depth in the performance of actors who played Su-yeon and Seon-yul is another element that adds astonishment to the film.

[Winner 2] Fragment | KIM Sung-yoon | Korea

Jury Comment: The film's sense of stability was impressive; it brought out the story's power to its maximum capacity. Instead of defining victim versus murderer, the film focused on the turmoil of emotion which happens within that relationship, and that resilient race was especially powerful. I also look forward to the three actors who showed good harmony in this film.



17. Watcha Short Award

[Winner] Lost Target | KIM Dongeun | Korea

Jury Comment: This work stands out for the director's exceptional talent for directly conveying the protagonist's dilemma to the audience. The archery scene, which could have easily come across as static, is instead transformed into a gripping experience through the compelling script and sophisticated editing, leaving a lasting impact.

18. Songwon Citizen Critics' Award

[Winner] The Final Semester | LEE Ran-hee | Korea

Jury Comment: *The Last Semester* tackles a relatable story through characters facing an important transition period in their lives. While the theme has its weight, the director manages to relay this in a calm and humorous manner. The direction and photography which walk alongside the actors, while also maintaining distance, makes the audience look forward to the characters' tomorrow as they steady on through a string of hardships.

19. Busan Cinephile Award

[Winner] No Other Land | Basel ADRA, Hamdan BALLAL, Yuval ABRAHAM, Rachel SZOR | Palestine/ Nepal

Jury Comment: This film depicts the small Palestinian village of Masafer Yatta, where residents have been stripped of their right to live. As suggested by the title *No Other Land*, not only the film depicts the story of residents who have lost their village, but also implies that in the face of ongoing threats of war, there is no longer land of safety. We all hope for a better life. Reflecting on their deprivation of the right to envision a future, we have chosen this work as the winner for capturing what should not be forgotten.



II. Final Report

1. The Film Festival Remains Resilient, Proven by the High Seat

Occupancy

A total of 278 official selections (including 54 from Community BIFF) were screened 633 times, resulting in a seat occupancy rate of 84% and drew a total audience of 145,238, a significant increase from last year. This marks the highest seat occupancy in the festival's history, even surpassing pre-pandemic years when over 300 films were featured. It was a year that reminded the festival's essential yet important role in showcasing great films at great venues to the so-called BIFF ambassadors who visit BIFF every year and to anyone who loves cinema.

2. Domestic and International Filmmakers and Actors to Shine the Festival

Director Kurosawa Kiyoshi, this year's Asian Filmmaker of the Year Award winner, and director Miguel Gomes whose entire features were presented through Special Program in Focus and also participated in Master Class, along with esteemed directors Patricia Mazuy, Ann Hui, Leos Carax, and Jia Zhang-Ke were among the distinguished guests. These directors joined with the audience through various events including film screenings. Actor Matsushige Yutaka, who can now be addressed as a director, joined the festival alongside actors Zhou Dongyu and Kani Kusruti who both joined as New Currents jury members. Actors Kim Sunyoung and Ryu Junyeol also joined the festival as the jury members of the Actor of the Year Award. These and many other filmmakers and actors from around the world shined the Busan International Film Festival.



3. More Diverse Events, Forums, and Actors' House

The Open Talk kicked off with the opening film *Uprising* and concluded with director Leos Carax of *It's Not Me* and actor Ryu Junyeol. This year's festival offered an expanded lineup of events, including Open Talk, Outdoor Greeting, Master Class, Special Talk, and also the reinstated Talk-to-Talk and Short Film, Long Chat. In total 46 events were held—15 more than last year—along with 303 GV sessions, creating more opportunities for filmmakers and audiences to connect. Notably, forums hosted by The E&M/DMP Studios, CJ ENM, Netflix provided filmmakers with practical industry insights. In its fourth year, Actors' House welcomed stars such as Sul Kyung-gu, Park Boyoung, Hwang Jung-min, and Chun Woohee, who shared candid stories behind-the-scene.

4. Enhanced Services with Daily Publications and Shuttle Operations

for Guests and Attendees

To provide more content and information to all festival visitors, the Korean and English daily magazine was relaunched for the first time in five years. Guest shuttles and a guest lounge also operated to provide convenient transportation and active networking for festival guests. Busan International Film Festival's culture project 'p!tt', first introduced in 2022, expanded the visitor lounge to offer a welcoming space for visitors to relax. Additionally, the merchandise shop featured special BIFF Ambassador merchandise and the 'At the Theater' package, offering audiences even more ways to enjoy the festival.

5. A Film Festival Unfolding Right by Myself: For Future Audiences, in the Heart of a Vibrant Square

This year marks the 7th anniversary of Community BIFF, a film festival crafted by the audience. With pride in being the only festival curated by its viewers, audience programmers are selected through open recruitment and voting. During the GV and talk sessions, film quizzes, reviews, and Q&As from the audience were displayed on the theater screen. One unforgettable moment was when Epik High performed the final two songs of



their film live in front of the screen, alongside the audience. In that instant, the theater was transformed into a concert hall, creating an immersive experience. While Community BIFF has always charmed audiences with its intimate, barrier-free atmosphere that brings artists and attendees closer together, this year's festival elevated that connection to new heights. The energy surged beyond mere warmth, drawing massive crowds to Nampo-dong Square, creating a vibrant, unforgettable experience for all who gathered.

6. Cinema on the Waves: A Rolling Ocean of Films from Sunset Viewpoints to the Airport

Now in its fourth year, BIFF Everywhere is a community-friendly festival that boldly expanded its reach to every corner of the region. Despite challenges like frequent rain and strong winds, which postponed the Sunsetfountain of Dreams event in Dadaepo, and changing screening venues from Domoheon and Hoedong Reservoir waterfront deck to indoors, no events were canceled. Alice Ko, the actor from *Someday or One Day*, engaged with the audience under an umbrella, receiving enthusiastic cheers. Sunset hotspots like Hwangnyeongsan in Yeonje-gu and Dadaepo in Saha-gu added to the experience with pre-screening performances, while architectural highlights like Berry Berry Good Bongsan Center and Domoheon captivated visitors. Additionally, venues like Domoheon and Millak Waterfront Park garnered praise for their sign language interpretation provided by the Korea Association of the Deaf, and both Gimhae International Airport and the National Assembly Hall in Yeouido joined the celebration for the second year in a row.

7. The Powerhouse of Innovation: Asian Contents & Film Market

This year's Asian Contents & Film Market saw record-breaking success, with 2,644 participants from 52 countries and a total of 26,435 visitors, a 37% increase from last year. The newly launched Producer Hub attracted 123 producers from 19 countries, fostering dynamic networking opportunities. The event, featuring Korea as 'Focus Country', was supported by participation from the Korean Film Council and partner organizations from



seven countries, marking a successful debut. In the sales market, 275 sellers and 563 buyers engaged in active content trading, while the Asian Project Market and Busan Story Market hosted 1,676 business meetings. The ACFM conference, which more than doubled in size compared to last year, received widespread praise, particularly for its AI conference which vitalized the market with its fresh, innovative ideas and energy. This year, ACFM achieved both quantitative and qualitative growth.

8. New Attempts Reflecting Global Trends, ACA & G.OTT Awards

The Asia Contents Awards & Global OTT Awards (ACA & G.OTT Awards) showcased diverse and innovative initiatives, reflecting the global content market trends. Introducing a Best Original Song category expanded the award categories, while the People's Choice Award enhanced audience participation and set the awards apart. ACA & G.OTT Awards took place with 11 competitive categories and 4 invited categories, where the renowned director Wong Kar-wai's first TV series, *Blossoms Shanghai*, won Best Creative, and its lead actor Hu Ge took home the Best Lead Actor (Male), making it a double winner. Ariel Lin from *Imperfect Us* won the Best Lead Actor (Female), and "Learn to Live Again", the original soundtrack of *Imperfect Us*, became the first winner of the newly established Best Original Song. Additionally, *Boyhood* won Best OTT Original, and Ahn Jaehong and Yeom Hye-ran from *Mask Girl* won Best Supporting Actor (Male) and (Female), respectively. Byeon Wooseok and Kim Hyeyoon from *Lovely Runner* swept the People's Choice Award, proving the strength of Korean content.

ii. Community BIFF

Community BIFF is a space for diverse experimentation and free exchange that uses films validated by the audience as a medium to change the way people view the world. This year's keywords were 'Future,' 'Pungnyu' (a term meaning refined elegance or artistic appreciation), and 'Youth.' With sci-fi films, AI, and new media, the festival explored the future of cinema and humanity, creating an exciting platform where future audiences could enjoy 'Pungnyu' and dream big. The 'Blind Cinema' event, in which audiences watched two films curated by literary critic Shin Hyoung-cheol and director Jung Sung-il back-to-back without prior information, was met with high praise for its honest discussions and excellent interpretations. Even after a full six hours, a 30-minute fan service session followed due to the overwhelming response. Students from the Convergence Arts College at Chugye University for the Arts, with which an Industry-Academic cooperation agreement was established, participated under the name 'BeMate,' offering passionate and dedicated support in publicity and monitoring efforts.

The increased subsidy budget and active support from local governments, along with collaboration and love calls from various institutions such as the Busan Cultural Foundation, the Directors Guild of Korea, Busan Museum of Movies, Federation of Busan Science and Technology, and Sangji Architects, made this possible. Actors Ahn Jaehong and Director Chang Hang-jun of *Rebound*, Director Lee Joon-ik and Actor Lee Joon-gi of *King and the Clown*, Director Choi Dong-hoon and Actor Ryu Junyeol of *Tazza: The High Rollers* and *Alienoid Parts 1 & 2*, Director Yoon Je-kyoon and Actor Chung Sung-hwa of *Hero*, Director Kim Jae-hwa, Actor Hong Kyung, Actor Park Kyuree, Zookeeper Kang Cherwon, Epik High, Actor Cho Jinwoong at the 29th BIFF Eve event, Genius Lee Seung-guk, and NewJeansNim, along with other professionals from various cultural fields, became friends with the audience at theaters and public spaces, cheering each other on, sharing empathy, creating bonds, and building lasting memories.

iii. BIFF Everywhere

BIFF Everywhere is a symbolic event that showcases the evolution of the festival spreading into everyday life. This year, with the theme of 'Connect', which links regions, cultures, generations, and the future, the festival discovered unique locations in Busan. It embraced even the unpredictable weather, turning it into part of the outdoor event's unique charm and enhancing the overall spectacle. Thanks to active support from district offices, Hwangnyeongsan Mt. Beacon Park (Yeonje-gu) and Dadaepo Sunsetfountain of Dreams (Saha-gu) captured the essence of BIFF Everywhere where sunsets, performances, night views, and cinema harmonized beautifully. At Millak Waterfront Park, the Taiwanese actor Alice Ko from *Someday or One Day* and the screen floating on the water captivated attention, while Domoheon (Suyeong-gu) achieved a barrier-free film festival with sign language interpretation. Locations such as Hoedong Reservoir (Geumjeong-gu) and the Berry Berry Good Bongsan Center (Yeongdo-gu), featuring stunning natural landscapes and popular hotspots, heightened the romance of autumn nights at the festival with Busan's unique scenery, sparking excitement and buzz on social media. This year, the festival even extended its reach beyond Busan to places like Gimhae International Airport's international terminal (Gangseo-gu) and the National Assembly Member's Office Building (Yeouido).

BIFF Everywhere aimed to establish the fundamental cultural right for everyone to enjoy and engage with films. It offered a diverse array of genres, including music, sports, comedy, romance, coming-of-age, animation, short films and many more, alongside special events featuring guest speakers. In particular, Village Filmmaking program which brought filmmaking closer to citizens, where they could produce and document community films. In its fourth year alongside BIFF Everywhere, Village Filmmaking resulted in the production of seven short films and four making documentaries since June. The program focused on empowering individuals from culturally marginalized groups, including migrant women, people with disabilities, and the elderly, to engage in creative culture. Many participants, previously unfamiliar with filmmaking, were captivated by the cinema, sparking hopes that this will become a driving force for the development of local cinema, propelling Busan toward becoming a city of cinema without language barriers. Through



BIFF Everywhere, the Busan citizens immersed themselves in the waves of cinema at every corner of Busan.

iv. Asian Contents & Film Market (ACFM)

The 2024 Asian Contents & Film Market achieved a record-breaking success with <u>a total</u> of 26,435 attendees over four days (20,586 visitors to the exhibition and 5,849 event participants). This marks an increase of <u>7,166 people, or 37.2%</u>, compared to the 2023 event, which recorded 19,269 attendees (15,400 exhibition visitors and 3,869 event participants).

This year, 2,644 registrants from 1,031 companies across 52 countries registered for the market badge, which is a rise of 3 countries, 113 companies, and 165 registrants (6.7%) from last year's 2479 registrants, 918 companies across 49 countries. Additionally, 275 companies from 30 countries, including 22 online participants, took part as exhibitors, and 563 buyers from 383 companies engaged in active content trading. The newly established Producer Hub, with Korea selected as this year's 'Focus Country', made a remarkable debut, fueled by the diverse collaboration and support of seven partner organizations, including the co-host Korean Film Council. Emerging directors and veteran producers engaged in active networking, sharing projects and insights from different countries. Notably, PGK achieved major milestones, including signing MOUs with Indonesia, Hong Kong (China), and Brazil. The AI Conference attracted a large audience and also was highly praised for incorporating fresh and innovative ideas, receiving many positive feedbacks for adding new energy to the market.
